Per First Baptist Church Bylaws

Article II, B. 3.

Church members who cannot be present the Sunday deacons are elected may vote ahead of time at the church office, where a list of members voting ahead of time will be kept. Extension or sick members may vote ahead of time with the help of extension visitors and others carrying them ballots. The ballots of members voting ahead of time will be counted with ballots cast by other members on the Sunday deacons are elected.

Seven Principles of Servant Leadership

- 7. Exodus 18:17-23** Servant leaders multiply their leadership by empowering others to lead.
